# GIRLY & GLAM TIN PAIL

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*Pump up the glam with this perfectly girly tin pail! It's the perfect catch-all, be it love notes or a boatload of bracelets!*

## SUPPLIES

- Tin Lunch Pail
- Scrapbook Page Kit, we chose a girly one!
- White Cardstock - 3 sheets
- Ribbon - black gingham check
- Embroidery Floss - black
- Double-Sided Adhesive Tape - in 1" and ¼" widths
- Ball Chain - black
- Sewing Needle
- Scissors
- Sewing Machine, the craft mini's work perfectly for this size project!

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Place two pieces of cardstock end-to-end (short side). Secure together with a piece of 1" tape centered over seam. Cut a 2 ½" strip of cardstock and attach to one end. Cut two 3 1/8" strips the length of the cardstock (3-1 1/8" x 24 1/2").
  2. Apply 1" tape around the edges of one piece of cardstock. Remove the film from the tape and attach the two pieces of cardstock together. Make sure to turn the strips so the seams do not match.
  3. Cut a 5 ½" wide piece from two coordinating papers. Cut the papers at matching angles. Then, cut a straight line on the side of the second paper. Add more of the first paper. Use tape to splice together.
  4. Set a sewing machine to a zigzag stitch. Remove thread from machine. Zigzag over the splice lines to mark the holes. Use two strands of embroidery floss to hand-sew in the zigzag holes; secure the floss with tape.
  5. Cover one side of the cardstock with 1" tape. Center the spliced paper over the cardstock; press in place. Fold the top and bottom edges over the back and secure with ¼" tape.
  6. Apply 1" tape to all back edges of the cardstock. Remove protective film. Wrap the cardstock around the pail just above the bottom lip. (Our seam is under the backside splice). Line up the spliced paper to the right side of the front. Press onto the pail. Line up ends as closely as possible, but not overlapping.
  7. Cut a piece of the second paper 3 ¼" long with angled sides. Use the machine to punch long stitch marks along the angled edge. Use floss to stitch. Place ¼" tape around the edges. Position over the seam. Press in place.
  8. Attach ribbon around the top edge of the cardstock with ¼" tape. Cut six 15" pieces of ribbon. Fold ribbons in half and tie around the handle. Angle-cut ribbon ends.
  9. From kit, select a punch-out and attach to the front with tape. Embellish with punch-out letters and a flower. Add two punch-out borders and glue more flowers to lid.
  10. Cut the ball chain to a small length and place around one side of the handle. To attach an initial, punch a hole in a letter and add to the chain.
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
